

# WHAT WE OFFER

The **Nova Southeastern University (NSU)** Psychological Services for the Emotionally Distressed (PSED) program serves adolescents (ages 14–18) and adults who are distressed as a result of disturbances in their mood or patterns of thinking. We focus on understanding the subjective experience of our patients and collaborating with them toward a better understanding of themselves, improving their capacity to cope.

Symptoms that may prompt people to contact our program include

- depression or mania
- hallucinations or delusions
- feeling like thoughts or behaviors are out of control
- difficulties in relationships
- frequent mood swings or difficulties regulating emotions
- · social isolation or withdrawal
- difficulties performing daily activities
- unusual behaviors or beliefs that are risky or distressing

#### SERVICES

- individual psychotherapy
- group psychotherapy
- family therapy
- couple therapy
- psychological testing (as needed, to inform treatment)

The primary approaches that inform our individualized work with clients include contemporary relational psychodynamic therapy, trauma-informed therapy, dialectical behavior therapy (DBT), cognitive therapy, and existential therapy.
